REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION

Thank you for your recent email, received by us on 2 July 2012, in which you asked for the following information:

Please provide all correspondence and any information since 2007 relating to 'Scotland's Aquaculture Database' including reference to "data cleansing".

Based upon information from the Marine Strategy Forum (enclosed below) it is understood that: "The proposal for a database, bringing together information from a variety of partner bodies, was made around two and a half years ago by the then head of the Marine Scotland Aquaculture Unit. Since then, a great deal of work has been done in developing the proposal, comparing and cleansing data, designing the website etc. A partnership approach has been adopted by the bodies involved (MS policy and Science, SEPA, the Crown Estate and Food Standards Agency (Scotland)), through a joint Working Group".

Moreover: "A test database/website has been subject, in the last couple of months, to initial User Acceptability Testing by partner bodies (with further work underway to address identified issues); The database/website will be rolled out to partner bodies later in July; we aim to launch it publicly at the end of July."

This FOI request therefore relates, inter alia, to the original proposal "made around two and a half years ago by the then head of the Marine Scotland Aquaculture Unit". This information would include any emails, phone calls, meetings, briefing notes, notes of Marine Strategy Forum meetings (as detailed below), data, test database/website, FOI replies and correspondence via the Marine Strategy Forum between Marine Scotland, SEPA, the Crown Estate and Food Standards Agency Scotland or any other information.

Please note that discussions of the Marine Strategy Forum referred to "data cleansing" – including a meeting on 15th June which included Marine Scotland policy and science. "Data Cleansing", according to Wikipedia relates to the deletion of 'dirty data', and is defined as follows:

Scotland's Aquaculture Database

Introduction

This paper outlines the background to the development of Scotland's aquaculture database and sets out some related issues. A demonstration of the database will be given to the Forum at the 15 June meeting.

Overview

The proposal for a database, bringing together information from a variety of partner bodies, was made around two and a half years ago by the then head of the Marine Scotland Aquaculture Unit. Since then, a great deal of work has been done in developing the proposal, comparing and cleansing data, designing the website etc. A partnership approach has been adopted by the bodies involved (MS policy and Science, SEPA, the Crown Estate and Food Standards Agency (Scotland)), through a joint Working Group. Work in developing the database and website has been undertaken on the partners' behalf by SEPA – who have also borne some additional costs over and above their proportionate share of project costs. SEPA will 'host' the website.

Although conceived initially as primarily a mechanism for partner bodies to compare and share information on aquaculture, the database/website allows the opportunity effectively to publish, on a proactive basis, a lot of information that would be releasable under Freedom of Information and Environmental Information legislation.

Current Progress

Policy, data cleansing/sharing arrangements and database and website development have now been taken to the stage where: A test database/website has been subject, in the last couple of months, to initial User Acceptability Testing by partner bodies (with further work underway to address identified issues);

The database/website will be rolled out to partner bodies later in July; we aim to launch it publicly at the end of July.

Governance arrangements have been developed and are being finalised relating to management, maintenance and other database requirements and responsibilities going forward. Amongst other things, the website will be maintained and serviced, on partners' behalf, by SEPA alongside SEWeb arrangements, with the partners sharing (modest) related costs. A Governance Group comprising key partner body representatives will continue to oversee and, where necessary, direct arrangements.

Stakeholder engagement

A communications strategy has been developed and is being refined, involving partner bodies communications teams, for both internal and external purposes. This includes:

- a) for internal partner purposes: initial User Acceptability Testing, demonstrations for key staff, utilisation of staff newsletters and internal websites/communications media. Partner users will be asked for feedback and evaluation of the website;
- b) for external interests: targeted preparatory presentations (including for some key stakeholder bodies and through the Marine Strategy Forum), proposed Ministerial Press Notice, references/cross-linkages in appropriate websites, leaflet/flier, material for inclusion in Schools pack (at an appropriate stage).

It is expected that the website will add to the transparency and openness agenda and will mean reduced FoI/EIR costs for partner bodies – though we recognise that, at least initially, the publication of data may give rise to interest and potential additional queries from some interests.

Wider data developments

Following on from the publication of Scotland's Marine Atlas last year, work is being undertaken to develop and bring together much of the data which was reflected in the Atlas and underpins marine planning. This is presently focussing on ensuring that the data presented in the Atlas, and the underlying datasets where possible, are available through National Marine Plan Interactive. Future work will include making broader datasets available; identifying and addressing key data gaps; and considering how best to make data available to support regional planning.
